The Pennsylvania Biotechnology Center was established around a vision to attract researchers and companies to build a biotechnology research community and launch new products and ideas in a collaborative, academic-entrepreneurial environment. Since its founding in 2006, the Center has attracted world-class research teams, early stage companies, and entrepreneurs to our state-of-the-art laboratory and office space in Doylestown, PA. We have become, arguably, one of the most successful life sciences incubators in the country.

Perhaps our novelty is in our culture, which attracts innovators from both pharma and universities-- people with ideas, who wish to road-test their ideas and turn them into a company. Our facility provides them with the environment and the resources of a large institution to help them grow their concept into a business.

The Center's location, in the heart of biotechnology corridor that runs between Princeton and Philadelphia, has played a key role in our success. The region is a hot spot for the biotech industry, which has allowed us to build a community of over 300 scientists

and researchers from around the world, with great potential for further growth.

Another key factor in our success has been the overwhelming support of our state and local legislators. Our representatives, from both sides of the aisle, have consistently provided support for our mission and vision for the future. Working together, we have been able to bring hundreds of life sciences jobs to Pennsylvania.

The support that we have been shown by the entrepreneurs, scientific leaders, government officials and the community as a whole has allowed us to create a facility that is in such demand that we have now broken ground on a \$14 million expansion, adding more laboratories and community areas, in order to accommodate the overwhelming demand for space within our Center.

We are proud that the Center has become integrated into the fabric of Bucks County and the larger region. We have been able to tap into the tremendous talent that exists in this area, and build a hub for biotechnology jobs and knowledge in southeastern PA.
